

## **Biewer's Favorite Treats, Toys & Puzzles**

### **Treats and Chews:**

Ziwi Peak and Vital Essentials are healthy brands for raw meat nib treats.

Bully Stick 6" put into a Bully Buddy (Bow Wow Labs Buddy Safety Device - Bully Stick Holder to prevent choking (XS and S size are good)

Chicken, Beef, Turkey Jerky (try making your own natural jerky)

Kong toys (XS and S size)

Beef Marrow Bone (raw and then we let them continue chewing bones inside once dry)

Cow Hooves (NOT stuffed, this is an ever-lasting chew)

Pig Ear / Lamb Ear / Cow Tail (plain, not smoked)

Yak Cheese Sticks / Himalayan Chews

1 Raw Chicken Egg – mixed with a fork.

We give outside in the summer on the patio:

Celery Stick with peanut butter.

Raw Beef Marrow Bone – supervised outside for 20 minutes, boil for 10 minutes then dry for inside.

Skinless Raw Chicken, Duck, or Turkey Wing, Drumstick, Neck (can eat the raw bone). Do not cook these bones!

Upset Stomach - add to food – Pure Pumpkin (pure canned or powder, not pie filling) – 1 tsp.
